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PAPPAS SUPPORT SLIDES, CD1 PRIMARIES DOWN TO THE WIRE

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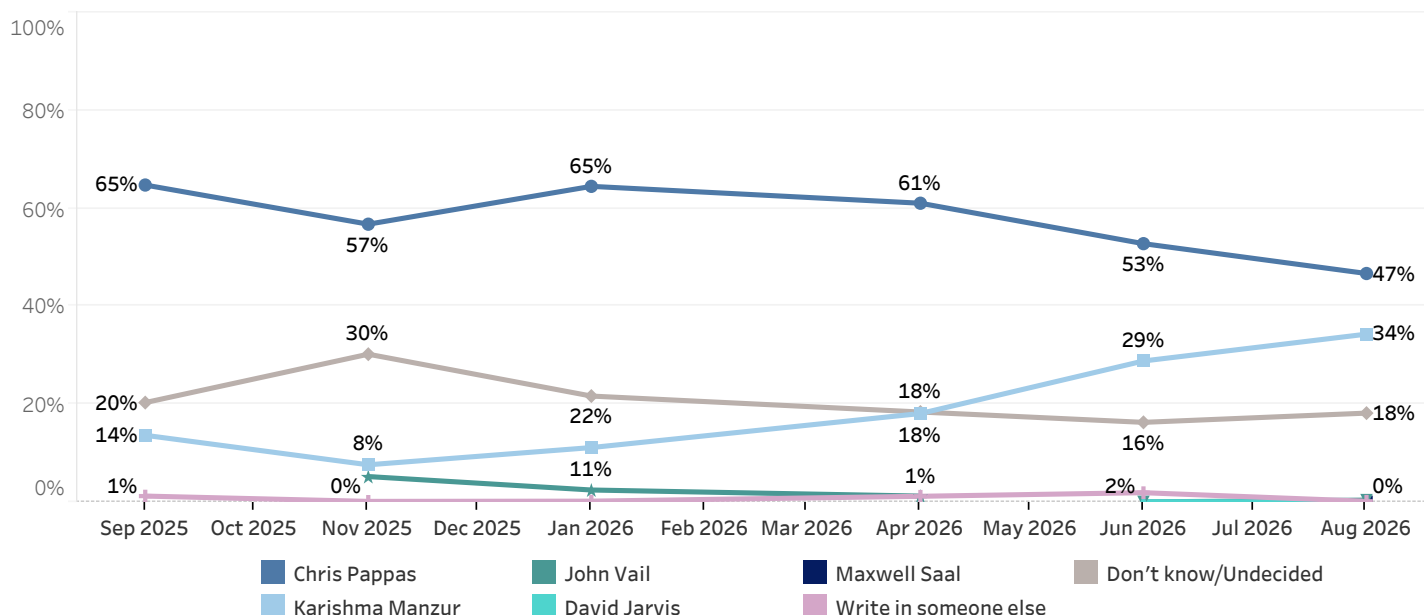
DURHAM, NH - First District Congressman Chris Pappas remains ahead in the race for the Democratic nomination for U.S. Senate, but Karishma Manzur continues to close the gap, fueled by strong support from socialist and younger voters. Former Senator John E. Sununu continues to lead former Massachusetts Senator Scott Brown on the Republican side and is statistically tied with Pappas in a general election matchup. In the Democratic primary in New Hampshire's First Congressional District, Maura Sullivan and Stefany Shaheen are statistically tied, followed by Carleigh Beriont. Hollie Noveletsky and Anthony DiLorenzo are also statistically tied on the Republican side. In the Second Congressional District, 2024 nominee Lily Tang Williams is the clear frontrunner for the 2026 Republican nomination while incumbent Democratic Congresswoman Maggie Goodlander is far ahead of challenger Paige Beauchemin.

2026 U.S. Senate Election

Congressman Chris Pappas remains the frontrunner in the Democratic primary for the U.S. Senate, but his lead over Karishma Manzur has shrunk since June. If the primary were held today, 47% of likely Democratic primary voters would vote for Pappas, 34% would vote for Manzur, less than 1% each would vote for John Vail, David Jarvis, Maxwell Saal, or for another candidate, and 18% are undecided. Most moderates (71%) and liberals (67%) support Pappas, while a plurality of progressives (43%) and most socialists (72%) support Manzur. Age is also an important factor: Pappas enjoys the support of most of those aged 65 and older (74%) and 50 to 64 (64%), while Manzur garners support from a plurality of those aged 35 to 49 (44%) and a majority of those aged 18 to 34 (53%).

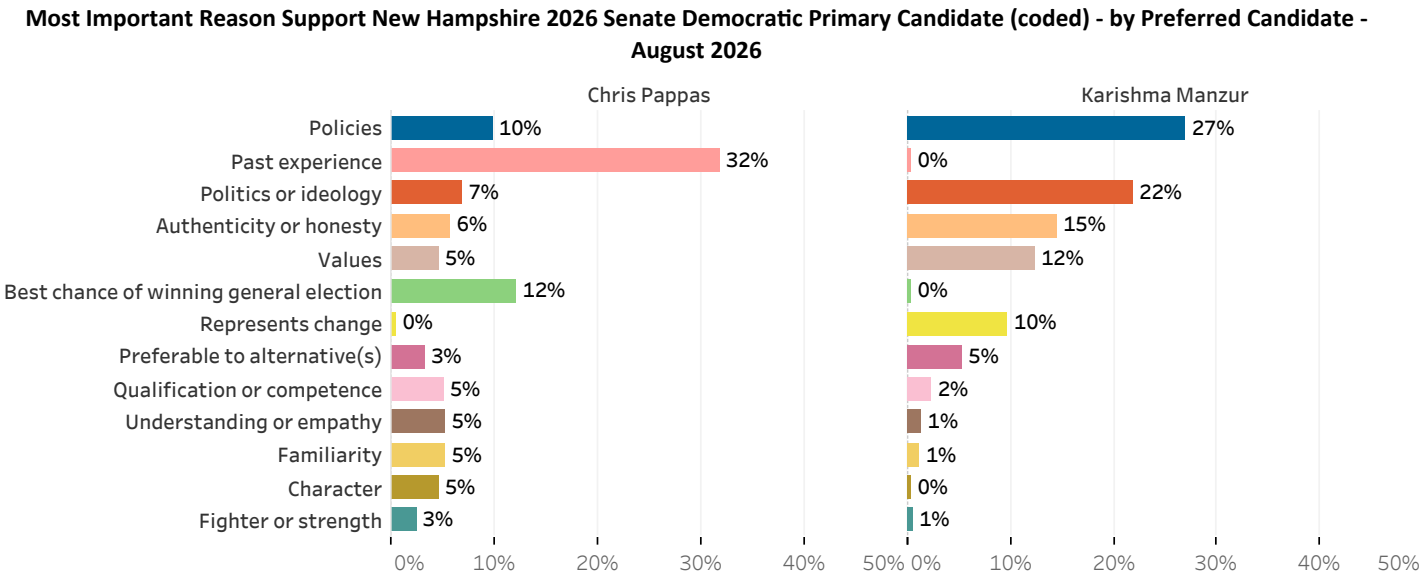
Half of likely Democratic primary voters (49%) have a favorable opinion of Pappas, 26% have an unfavorable opinion, 18% are neutral, and 7% don't know enough about him to say. Pappas's net favorability rating among Democratic primary voters (the percentage who have a favorable opinion minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion) is +23, down from +32 in June and +45 in April. Forty-one percent have a favorable opinion of Manzur, 6% have an unfavorable opinion, 12% are neutral, and 41% don't know enough about her to have an opinion. Manzur's net favorability among Democratic primary voters is +35, up from +23 in June. Most likely Democratic primary voters don't know enough to have an opinion about Jarvis (77%), Vail (78%), or Saal (80%).

New Hampshire 2026 U.S. Senate Democratic Primary



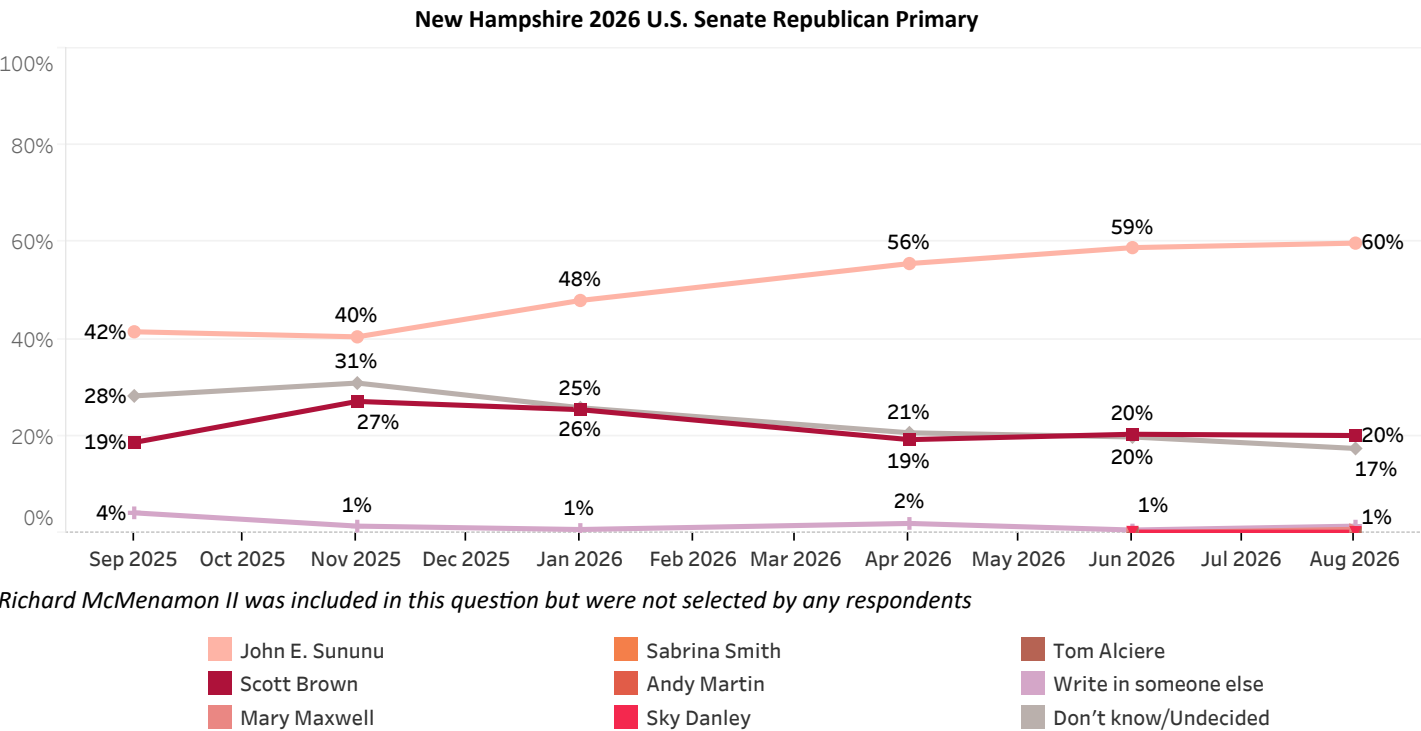

When likely Democratic primary voters are asked why they support their preferred candidate for U.S. Senate, Pappas supporters are most likely to say it is because of his past experience (32%) or having the best chance of winning the general election (12%), while Manzur supporters are most likely to cite her policies (27%) or her politics or ideology (22%).

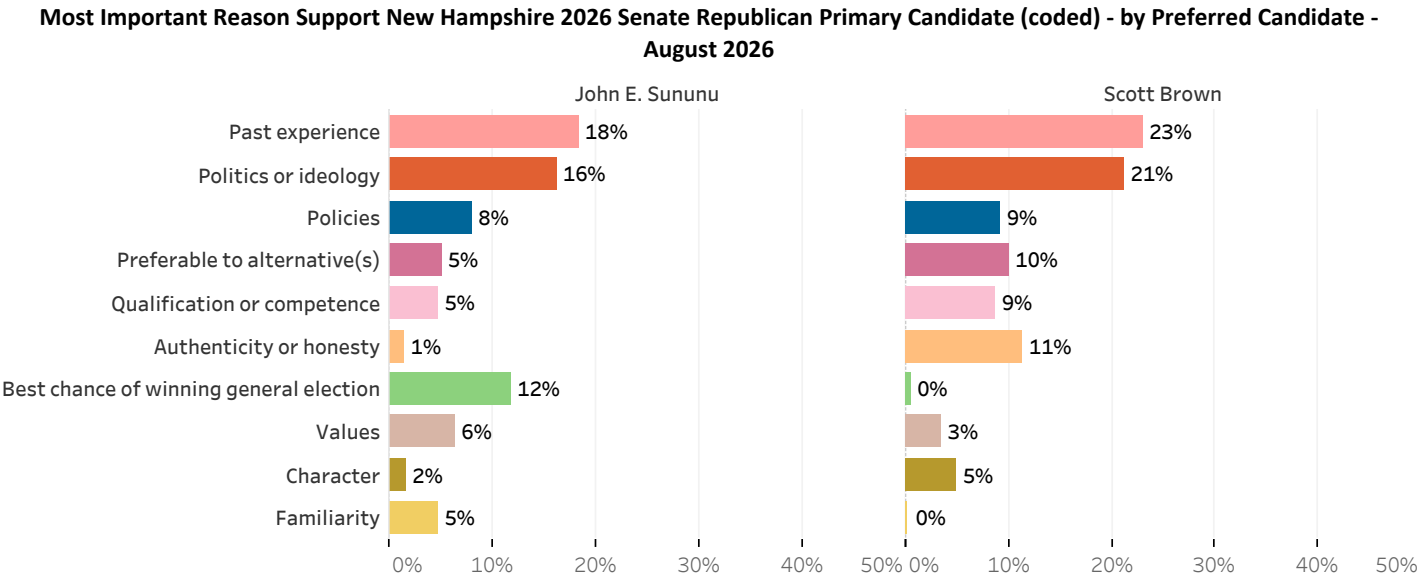


On the Republican side, former Senator John E. Sununu continues to hold a commanding lead in the New Hampshire Republican primary for U.S. Senate. Among likely 2026 Republican primary voters, 60% say they would vote for Sununu if the primary were held today, 20% would vote for Scott Brown, 1% would vote for Mary Maxwell, less than 1% each would vote for Sabrina Smith, Andy Martin, Sky Danley, or Tom Alciere, 1% would write in another candidate, and 17% are undecided. Responses are largely unchanged since June. Sununu has the support of majorities of moderates (69%), conservatives (60%), and libertarians (56%).

Sixty-two percent of likely Republican primary voters have a favorable opinion of Sununu, 12% have an unfavorable opinion, 22% are neutral, and 4% don't know enough about him to say. Sununu's net favorability rating among Republican primary voters is +50, up from +36 in June. Thirty-five percent have a favorable opinion of Brown, 22% have an unfavorable opinion, 32% are neutral, and 11% don't know enough about him to have an opinion. Brown's net favorability among likely Republican primary voters is +13, up from -3 in June. Most likely Republican primary voters don't know enough to have an opinion about Martin (74%), Alciere (75%), Maxwell (78%), Smith (78%), Danley (79%), or Richard McMenamon II (80%).



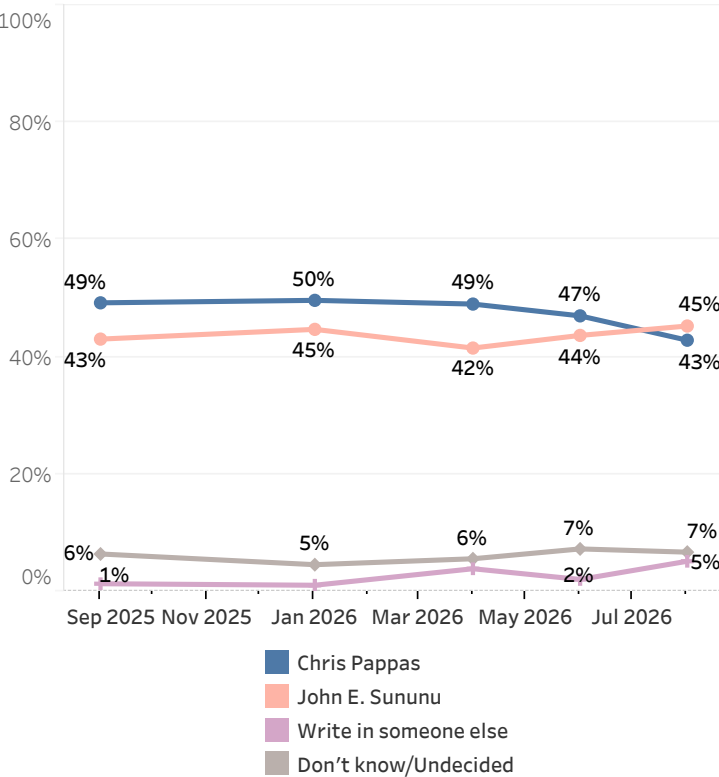
When likely Republican primary voters are asked why they support their preferred candidate for U.S. Senate, Sununu supporters are most likely to mention his past experience (18%), politics or ideology (16%), or having the best chance to win the general election (12%), while Brown voters are most likely to mention his past experience (23%), politics or ideology (21%), or authenticity or honesty (11%).



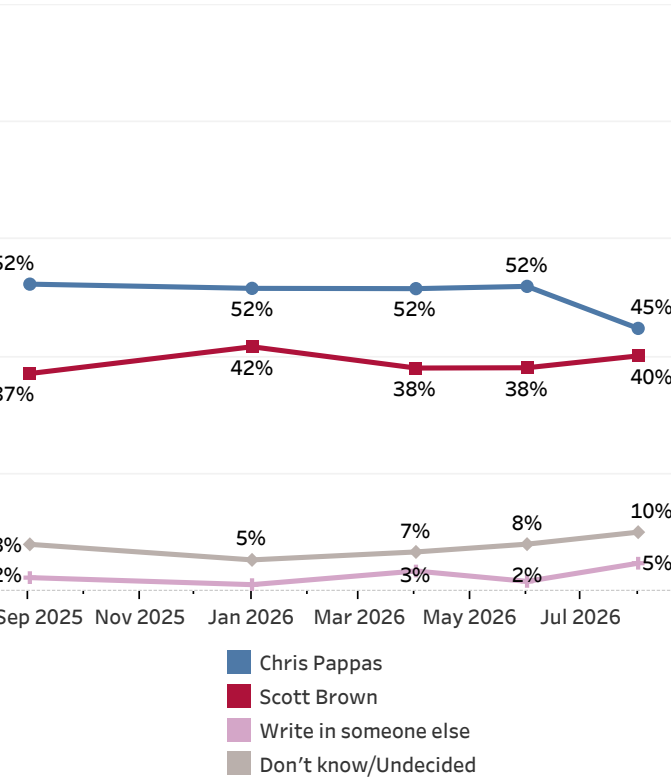
In a general election matchup between Pappas and Sununu, 45% of likely general election voters say they would vote for Sununu if the general election were held today, 43% would vote for Pappas, 5% would vote for another candidate, and 7% are undecided. This race remains a statistical tie: in June, Pappas was three percentage points ahead of Sununu. Eighty-five percent of Democrats would vote for Pappas while 92% of Republicans and plurality of Independents (41%) would vote for Sununu.

If Brown wins the nomination, 45% of likely general election voters say they would vote for Pappas, 40% would vote for Brown, 5% would vote for another candidate, and 10% are undecided. In June, Pappas held a fourteen percentage point lead over Brown. Eighty-seven percent of Democrats and a plurality of Independents (44%) would vote for Pappas while 84% of Republicans would vote for Brown.

New Hampshire 2026 U.S. Senate General Election - Pappas vs. Brown

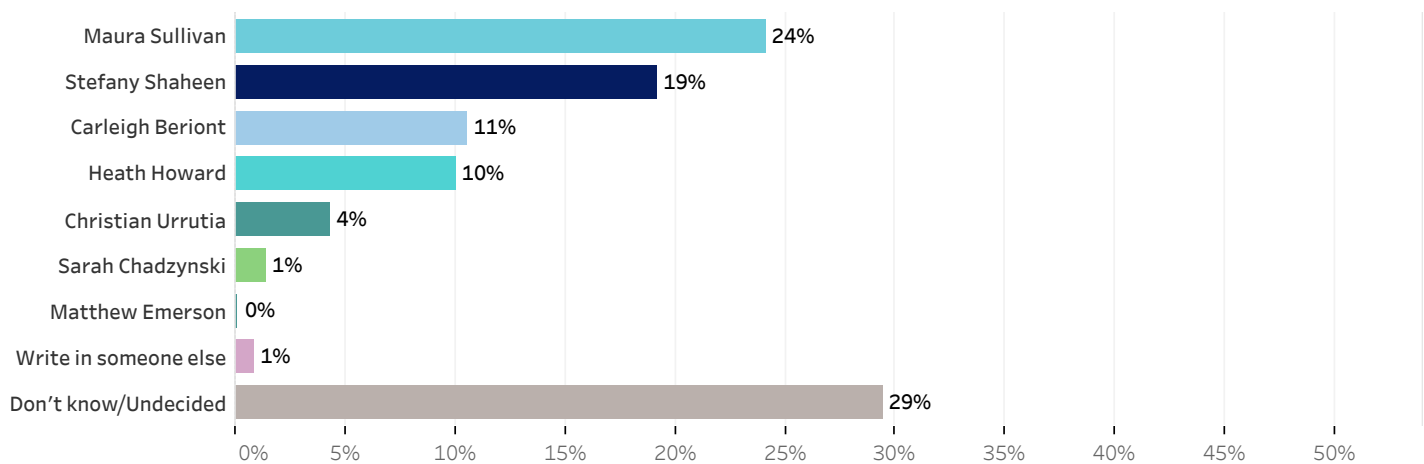


2026 NH 1st Congressional District Election

In the race for the open seat in New Hampshire's 1st Congressional District, Maura Sullivan and Stefany Shaheen are in a statistical tie. If the Democratic primary were held today, 24% of likely Democratic primary voters would vote for Maura Sullivan, 19% would vote for Stefany Shaheen, 11% would vote for Carleigh Beriont, 10% would vote for Heath Howard, 4% would vote for Christian Urrutia, 1% would vote for Sarah Chadzynski, less than 1% would vote for Matthew Emerson, 1% would write in someone else, and 29% are undecided. After this poll concluded, Heath Howard withdrew from the race and endorsed Carleigh Beriont. Moderates tend to favor Sullivan, liberals tend to prefer Shaheen, progressives are divided between Sullivan, Shaheen, Beriont, and Howard, and socialists tend to prefer Howard or Beriont.

Thirty-eight percent of likely CD1 Democratic primary voters have a favorable opinion of Sullivan, 20% have an unfavorable opinion, 20% are neutral, and 23% don't know enough about her to say, yielding a net favorability rating of +18. Thirty-eight percent have a favorable opinion of Shaheen, 24% have an unfavorable opinion, 26% are neutral, and 12% don't know enough about her to say, yielding a net favorability rating of +14. Beriont (+23) has a slightly higher net favorability rating than either Sullivan or Shaheen, but more than half (54%) do not know enough to have an opinion about her. Majorities of CD1 likely Democratic primary voters don't know enough to have an opinion of Urrutia (55%), Chadzynski (73%), Bill Conlin (78%), Sarah Spinosa (80%), or Emerson (82%).

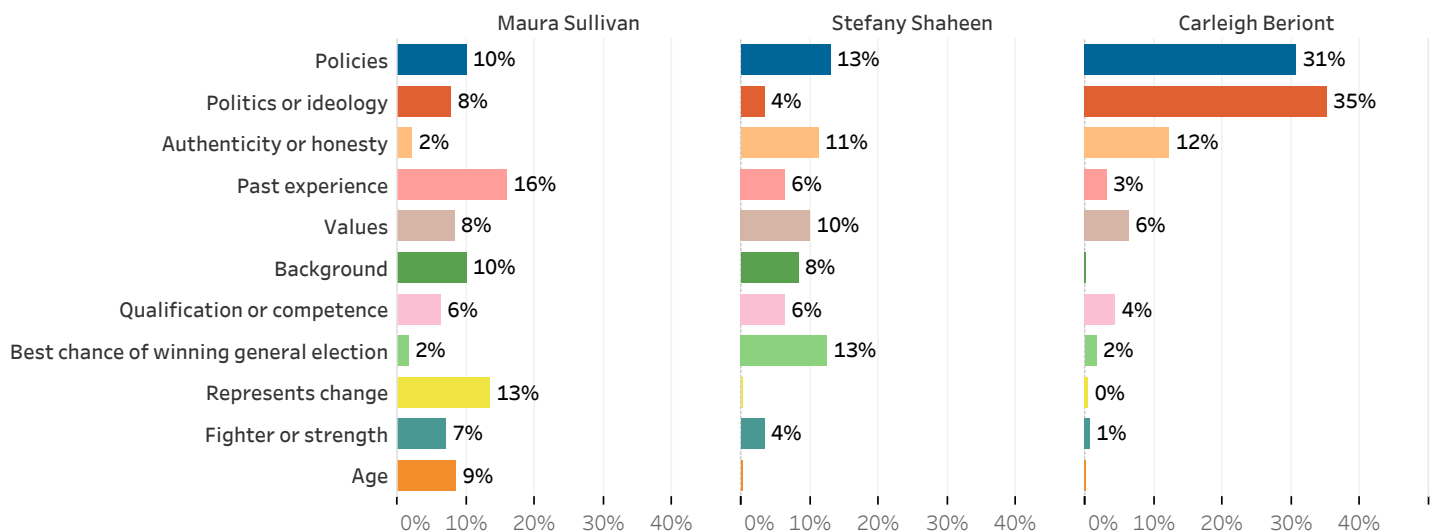
New Hampshire 2026 First U.S. Congressional District Democratic Primary - August 2026

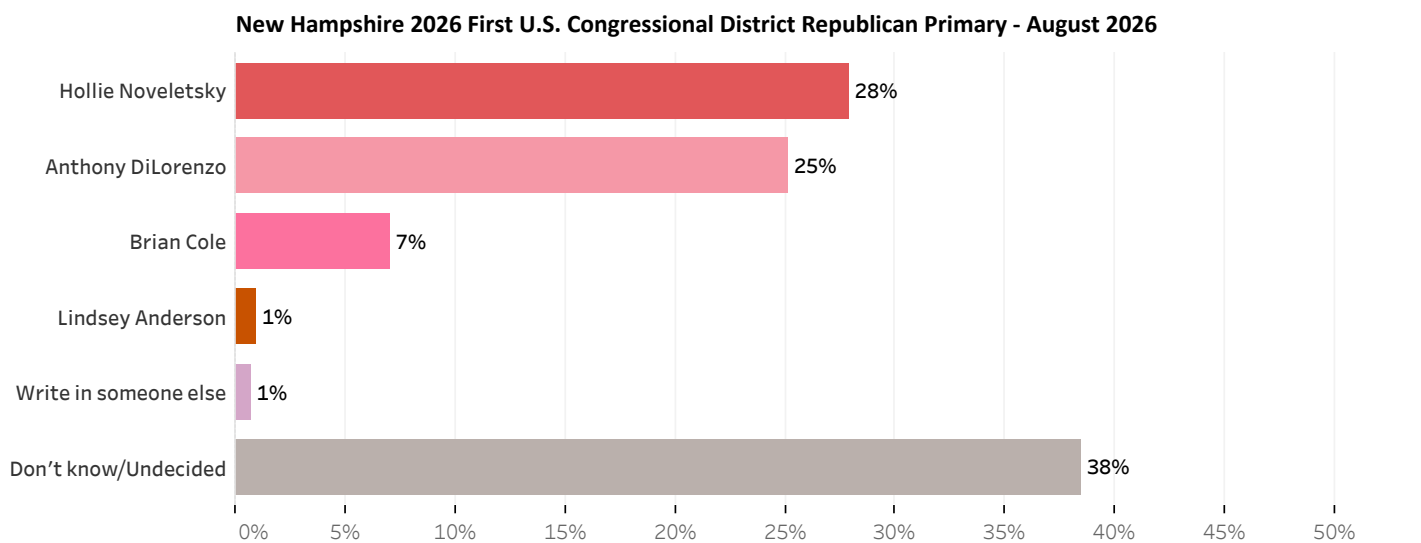
When likely CD1 Democratic primary voters are asked why they support their preferred candidate for Congress, Sullivan supporters most often mention her past experience (16%) and that she represents change (13%), Shaheen supporters most often mention her policies (13%), having the best chance to win the general election (13%), or her authenticity or honesty (11%), and Beriont supporters most often mention her politics or ideology (35%) or her policies (31%).

Most Important Reason Support New Hampshire 2026 1st Congressional District Democratic Primary Candidate (coded) - by Preferred Candidate - August 2026

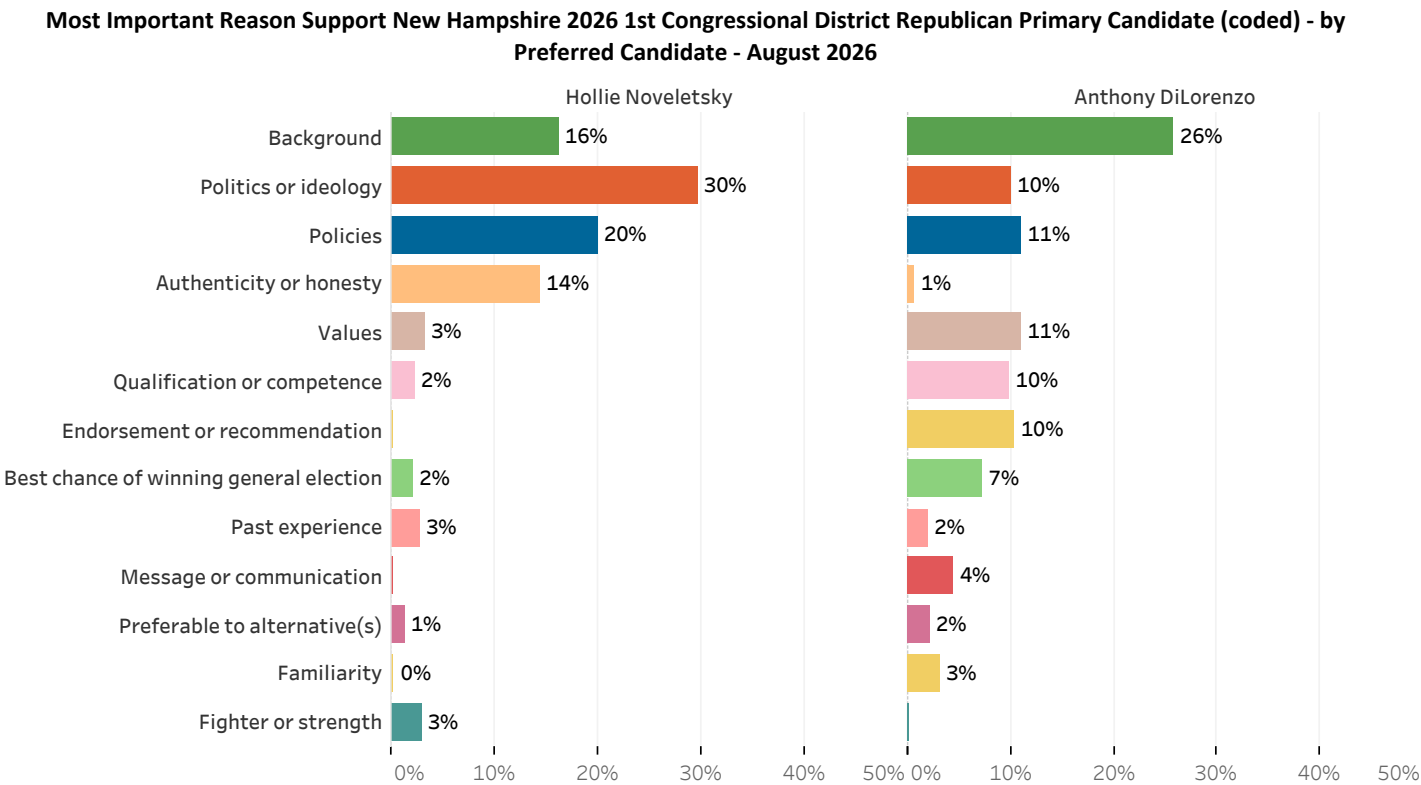


The Republican race for the First District nomination is also statistically tied: 28% of likely 1st CD Republican primary voters say they would vote for Hollie Noveletsky if the primary were held today, 25% would vote for Anthony DiLorenzo, 7% would vote for Brian Cole, 1% would vote for Lindsey Anderson, 1% would write in someone else, and 38% are undecided. Conservatives show a slight preference for DiLorenzo, while Noveletsky is ahead among moderates and libertarians, though majorities of the latter two groups are undecided.

Thirty-four percent of likely CD1 Republican primary voters have a favorable opinion of Noveletsky, 8% have an unfavorable opinion, 19% are neutral, and 39% don't know enough about her to say, yielding a net favorability rating of +26. Thirty-two percent have a favorable opinion of DiLorenzo, 19% have an unfavorable opinion, 27% are neutral, and 22% don't know enough to have an opinion, yielding a net favorability rating of +13. Eleven percent have a favorable opinion of Cole, 14% have an unfavorable opinion, 28% are neutral, and 47% are unsure, yielding a net favorability rating of -3. Most (77%) don't know enough about Anderson to have an opinion of him.



When likely CD1 Republican primary voters are asked why they support their preferred candidate for Congress, Noveletsky supporters are most likely to mention her politics or ideology (30%), policies (20%), background (16%), or her authenticity or honesty (14%), while DiLorenzo supporters are most likely to mention his background (26%), values (11%), policies (11%), qualifications or competence (10%), his politics or ideology (10%), or mention an endorsement or recommendation (10%).

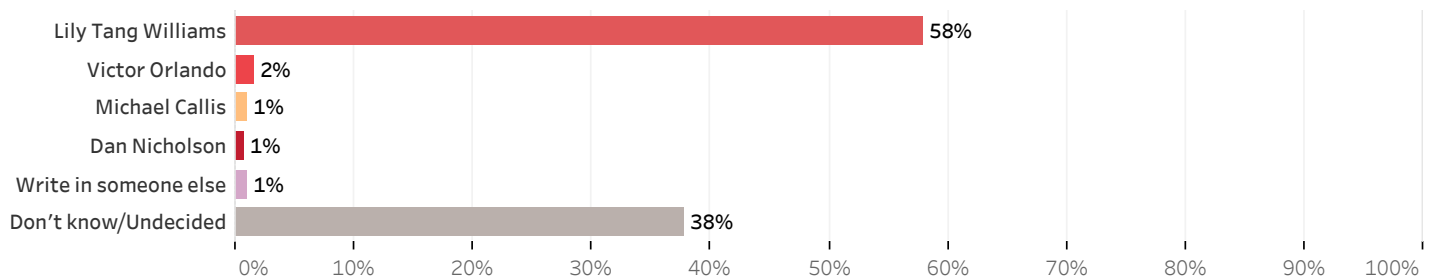


2026 NH 2nd Congressional District Election

In New Hampshire's 2nd Congressional District, 2024 Republican nominee Lily Tang Williams is the clear frontrunner for the 2026 Republican nomination. If the primary were held today, 58% of likely Republican primary voters would vote for Tang Williams, 2% would vote for Victor Orlando, 1% each would vote for Michael Callis or Dan Nicholson or would write in someone else, and 38% are undecided. Tang Williams's greatest support comes from conservatives (68%), while about half of moderates (52%) and libertarians (48%) are undecided.

Sixty-two percent of likely CD2 Republican primary voters have a favorable opinion of Tang Williams, 9% have an unfavorable opinion, 13% are neutral, and 16% don't know enough about her to say, yielding a net favorability rating of +53. Most likely CD2 Republican primary voters don't know enough about Orlando (76%), Nicholson (79%), or Callis (82%) to have an opinion of them.

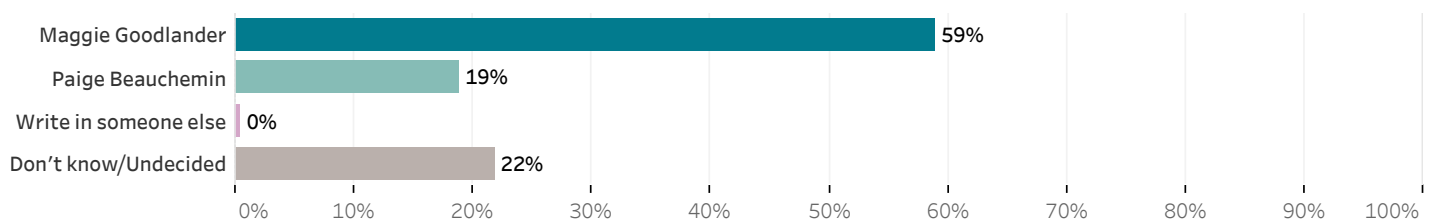
New Hampshire 2026 Second Congressional District Republican Primary - August 2026



On the Democratic side, incumbent Congresswoman Maggie Goodlander is seeking re-election and holds a wide lead in the race for the nomination. If the primary were held today, 59% of likely Democratic primary voters would vote for Goodlander, 19% would vote for Paige Beauchemin, less than 1% would write in someone else, and 22% are undecided. Goodlander has the support of most liberals (79%) and moderates (76%), along with the plurality of progressives (47%), while among socialists 45% support Beauchemin and only 19% support Goodlander.

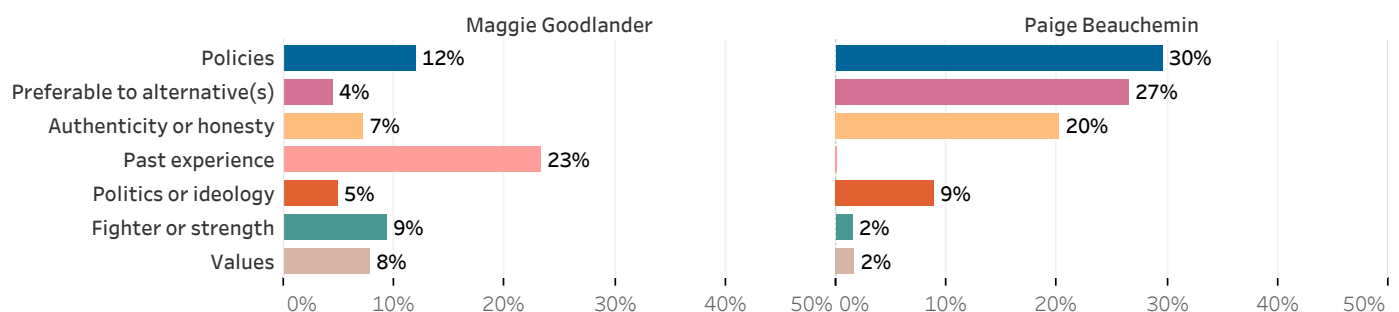
Fifty-seven percent of likely CD2 Democratic primary voters have a favorable opinion of Goodlander, 16% have an unfavorable opinion, 20% are neutral, and 7% don't know enough about her to say, yielding a net favorability rating of +40. Nineteen percent have a favorable opinion of Beauchemin, 6% have an unfavorable opinion, 16% are neutral, and 60% don't know enough about her to say, yielding a net favorability rating of +13.

When likely CD2 Democratic primary voters are asked why they support their preferred candidate for Congress, Goodlander supporters are most likely to mention her past experience (23%) or policies (12%) while Beauchemin supporters are most likely to mention her policies (30%), being preferable to the alternative (27%), or her authenticity or honesty (20%).

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Granite State Panel members were sent an invitation to complete the survey and 1,418 completed the survey online, yielding a response rate of 33%. In addition, 725 New Hampshire residents completed the survey after receiving an invitation via text message to complete the survey. Overall, 2,143 New Hampshire residents completed the survey online between August 20 and August 24, 2026. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 2.1 percent.

Included in the sample were 1,878 likely general election voters (margin of sampling error +/- 2.3 percent). Also included in the sample were 893 likely 2026 Democratic state primary voters (MOE +/- 3.3 percent), 463 of whom reside in New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MOE +/- 4.6 percent) and 430 of whom reside in New Hampshire's Second Congressional District (MOE +/- 4.7 percent). Also included in the sample were 856 likely 2026 Republican state primary voters (MOE +/- 3.3 percent), 464 of whom reside in New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MOE +/- 4.5 percent) and 387 of whom reside in New Hampshire's Second Congressional District (MOE +/- 5.0 percent). In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.9%.

The Granite State Panel is a probability-based web panel of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 8,500 New Hampshire adults have been recruited from phone, text-to-web, or mail-to-web surveys sent to randomly-selected phone numbers or addresses. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2024 election results in New Hampshire. Surveys were taken in English, all respondent data included passes Qualtrics data quality checks, and single-use survey links were used to prevent multiple submissions by respondents.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. All coding of open-ended responses is conducted using AI coding software.
